Shrouded in the History of Bowls!!

Bowls Australia's members are the nine state and territory bowls associations. There are over 2,000 clubs and 240,000 registered participants affiliated with member states and territories.

Lawn bowls rules state that 'The jack shall be round and white (or yellow) with a diameter of not less than 2 15/32 inches, nor more than 2 17/32 inches and not less than 8 oz nor more than 10 oz in weight.'

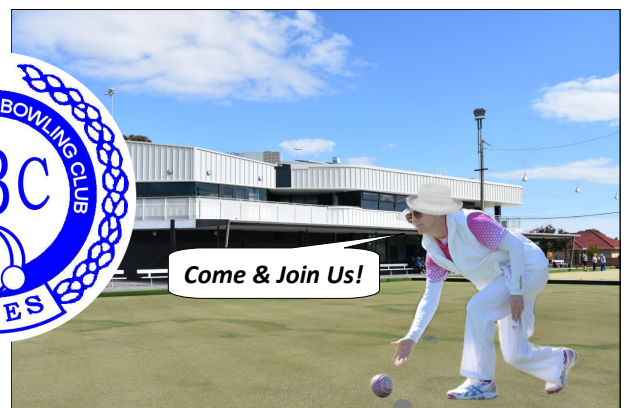
Health professionals recommend playing bowls, particularly for older people, as it provides a number of health benefits, including: improved fitness. improved coordination and skill development. increased confidence and self-esteem.

Do we have to bowl barefoot? Barefoot bowling is preferred but socks, thongs or flat, soft soled shoes are also acceptable. No type of heels, wedges or spikes are allowed.

Let new players know how to identify the 'bias' side by the smaller of the circles or logos marked on the bowl. As you hold the bowl in front of you, the little circles would always be facing the centre of the rink. Many players will think about the opposition and their history or recent form.

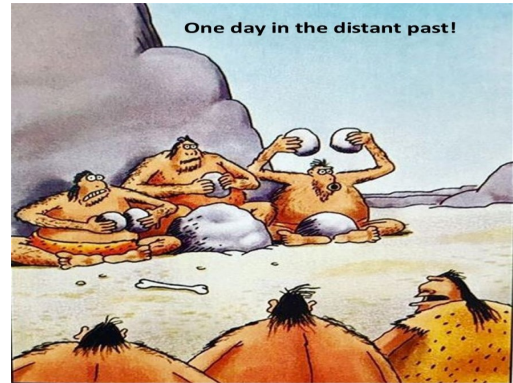

We now wonder if the picture above has any bearing on the history of lawn bowls?

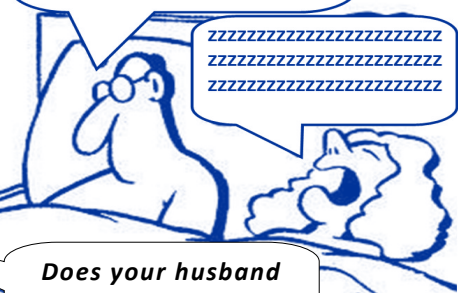
