









IN DAYS GONE BY

Some early photos relating to Claremont Bowls Club have been un-earthed.

- 1. taken from the air (late 1950's) showing that the top green was well on the way, but no club rooms etc.
- 2. Cadburys old library was donated to the bowls club and became part of the club rooms. It was dragged over the road.
- 3. Another air photo in the early 1960's shows the club rooms now built and a hedge right around the right hand side of the green. The golf club pavilion is on the left.
- 4. Extension of the club rooms to the north in early 1990's.

The story goes that the executives at Cadburys in the 1950's called together their managers and said an area of land had been put aside for the development of a bowls club. The managers were told to go ahead and make it happen. The late Dudley

Coleman was one of those managers and at the time had no knowledge of bowls. This was to change as soon they got plans underway for a green, a pavilion and car parking.



The inaugural meeting was held on 27th June 1960, at which there were present four persons who were golf members and also employees of Cadburys, nine golfers and four Cadbury employees. Also, in attendance by invitation were the president and three other senior executives of the Southern Tasmanian Bowls Association, all of whom were not only top administrators but also top bowlers.

It was pointed out that the first steps required were to appoint a committee and draw up rules for the new club. This was done immediately with Mr. A Rothwell appointed president and an examination of the golf club rules indicated that these were suitable for the following by the bowls club. A few minor amendments only were needed.

To ensure that an experienced person be available to interpret these rules it was decided that future bowls club committees would be represented by at least one registered golfer. Whilst fixing the rules to incorporate this requirement the opportunity was taken to also include a proviso that at least two Cadbury employees form part of the committee.
