He came from England and During WW2 he was part of No 620 Squadron which was formed at Chedburgh on 17 June 1943 as a heavy bomber squadron equipped with Stirlings and began operations almost immedi-



ately. It carried out night bombing missions until November 1943 when it moved to Leicester in preparation for airborne

forces operations. Between October 1945 and April 1946 the Squadron was used for trooping flights to and from India, before disbanding on 25 May 1946. The Squadron was involved in many Allied operations including 'Market Garden', which was depicted in the film 'A

Bridge Too Far'.

Allan played bowls, soccer, cricket & snooker/billiards.

He came to Tasmania with his wife Eunice and played bowls with Claremont for some time.

He wrote a joke book on bowls and here are two stories (we don't know how true they are!): -


